

SDC CHILD CARE PROGRAM matching forgivable loan funds are available up to \$1,000 per child as a dollar for dollar match not to exceed \$30,000 for group and \$100,000 for center.



APPROVED GRANTS & FORGIVABLE LOANS

The Facade Improvement Program consist of two programs the **Facade Improvement Program** and the **Multi-Tenant Facade Improvement Program**. The Facade Improvement Program is designed to improve the physical appearance and aesthetics of stand-alone properties, suitable projects may be eligible for a matching forgivable loan of project funds up to a maximum of **\$25,000** per street facing facade. The Multi-Tenant Facade Improvement Program is designed to enhance the storefront in multi-tenant facilities and create a positive retail image, suitable projects may be eligible for a matching forgivable loan of project funds up to a storefront.

HEARTVIEW FOUNDATION received a \$1.6 million contract from the North Dakota Department of Human Services Behavioral Health Division in 2022 to open a new location in Dickinson. The 16-bed residential treatment facility is under construction in the old CHI hospital and construction is scheduled to be complete in early June 2023. To begin with, the facility will provide 24-hour, supervised residential care for adults with substance use disorders, but Kurt Snyder, executive director of the Heartview Foundation, hopes to expand to outpatient services quickly.


The Heartview Foundation Board of Directors added three members in 2022 to represent Dickinson, Senator Rich Wardner, Michael Riesinger, and Vaune Johnson. The organization is currently in the process of hiring a Dickinson-based chief operating officer and is excited to get involved with the community.



"We are excited to provide substance abuse treatment services to western North Dakota, an area with a great need," says Snyder, a Dickinson native. "The residential setting will provide a safe, supportive environment for withdrawal and will provide an opportunity for patients to learn basic coping skills, but we know patients are most successful in long-term outpatient treatment."


APPROVED INTEREST BUYDOWN PROGRAM PROJECTS

The **"Partnership in Assisting Community Expansion Program"** (PACE) helps communities expand their economic base by assisting Primary Sector businesses that make an investment or create jobs in their community. Primary sector businesses must create new wealth, defined as revenues generated through the sale of products or services to customers outside of ND or customers in ND if the products or services were previously unavailable or difficult to obtain from business within the state.



APPROVED INTEREST BUYDOWN PROGRAM PROJECTS

Flex PACE allows communities the ability to provide assistance to businesses that do not meet the primary sector definition of PACE without requiring job creation. The PACE programs allow Stark Development Corporation to partner with the Bank of North Dakota to assist in buying down the interest rate for the borrower. The interest rate to the borrower may be as much as 5% below the rate on the promissory note, but not less than 5% below Prime with a floor of 1%.

BUILDING REVITALIZATION PROGRAM GRANT

M SQUARED LLC received **\$50,000** in building revitalization matching grant funds to redevelop the former Stark County social services building located at 664 12th St West in Dickinson. The redevelopment of the facility created a space for an oral and facial surgery center and other commercial opportunities. The addition of an oral and facial surgery center has filled a need which has been vacant for many years.





The **Building Revitalization Grant** assists property owners bringing commercial buildings into compliance with local and national building codes to provide new commercial, retail and restaurant opportunities in Stark County.

The Building Revitalization Grant committee will review and score applications quarterly. Awards up to \$50,000 in matching funds are available through this competitive process as determined by the merits of the application. Funds are limited and not predetermined. Accepted costs can include, but are not limited to, accessibility and ADA improvements, fire suppression, hazardous materials abatement, structural issues, plumbing and HVAC updates as required by building code.

- · Eligible projects must be opening a new business or significantly expanding their business
- · Priority will be given to projects opening in shuttered buildings or properties
- Renovations preserving the integrity or historical nature of buildings are encouraged
- Special consideration will be given to projects that create new revenue streams via sales tax, hospitality tax and property tax
- Projects improvements shall be universal in nature and not overly specific to the current occupant or tenant



INSPIRATION STATION

DICKINSON - Ashley Rasmussen and Erika Sickler, owners of the Inspiration Station, have always had a passion for caring for children and helping them learn. Together they have worked with the assistance of the ND SBDC to expand their childcare and preschool facility into what it is today.

A business that started out in Ashley's home with just 12 children, has now expanded to allow up to 57 children. The business has moved to a much larger facility and has created three other full-time jobs and a part-time position with plans to add more staff in the future.

The Inspiration Station opened on August 22, 2022 and provides daycare for children 0-6 years old. In addition to daycare, they also offer two preschool sessions - morning and afternoon. The team said, "this allows for parents to not have to leave work to take their children to preschool. We also offer preschool enrollment to children not in the daycare."

The duo said, "It's such a rewarding career knowing that we play such

a critical role in the children's development. When our wait-list wouldn't stop growing, we knew we could expand."

With their expansion, Ashley and Erika really wanted their new location to feel like a home. They wanted windows, natural light, a welcoming and safe environment as well as caring staff for the children enrolled. Their new facility has such a unique set up and provides them with all of this.

In addition to the support of the families that attend the Inspiration Station, the business has had the



support of many other individuals as well. They stated, "We have had an amazing team behind us in every aspect of starting this business. We are so thankful for the team at the ND SBDC, Cornerstone Bank, the team at Stark Development Corporation, and our families. Without their support and help along the way this would not have been possible."

Before securing the building for their business, Ashley and Erika knew they wanted a solid business plan. Their banker referred them to Matt, the Dickinson ND SBDC advisor, who helped them look over their business plan and answered their other questions. Because of their business plan, they have been able to grow their business and open their larger facility.



Stark Development has invested \$218,815 in assistance to help revitalize the St. Joe's Plaza. Currently there are over thirty tenants in the facility and nine received assistance from SDC. Restaurants, salons, daycare facilitates, recreational, professional and health and fitness are among the businesses currently located in the Plaza. In June of 2023, The Heartview Foundation will complete their renovation project of the fourth floor and bring 16 beds of in-patient behavioral health treatment to the community and region. This once exempt facility is now creating a significant impact on the economic diversity of the community and providing an additional tax base.
